Mayo Clinic Blood Donor Center invites you to join the team and donate blood!

Every six minutes, a patient at Mayo Clinic needs a transfusion of blood or blood products. A simple blood donation can save the life of a child with leukemia, restore the strength of a cancer patient or provide a critical transfusion to an accident victim. There is no substitute for this life-saving gift, so our patients rely upon the caring spirit of blood donors like you.

In 2006, the Knights of Columbus of Olmsted County joined the Mayo Clinic Blood Assurance Group Program (www.mayoclinic.org/donate-blood-rst). All Knights of Columbus members belonging to the seven councils in Olmsted County are eligible to receive the benefits of belonging to this group, regardless of whether you can donate blood or not. Together we can help meet the community's needs and lower your costs if you ever need blood.

When a group such as the Knights of Columbus participates in the Blood Assurance Program, the Mayo Clinic Blood Donor Center waives the processing fees not covered by insurance for banked blood products, (red blood cells, fresh frozen plasma, platelets and cryoprecipitate). This benefit applies to all donating and non-donating members, employees and their families, as defined by the Internal Revenue Service that belong to a K of C council in Olmsted County! If you ever need to receive blood from a non-Mayo facility, you must produce proof of receiving blood to receive reimbursement.




