# A Journey to a Joyful Moment



On November 19, 2013, the dedication of a new ultrasound machine was held at the Total Life Care Center (TLCC) in Hastings, MN. TLCC is a life-affirming, non-profit ministry established to serve individuals and families in crises. Funding was provided by the Knights of Columbus and private donations.

This journey began some 2 ½ years ago when a Knights of Columbus member approached Council 1013 at St. John's and expressed an interest in pursuing an ultrasound ma-

chine through the K of C's national Ultrasound Initiative. After doing some checking on the details of the program, we learned that the Knights of Columbus Supreme Office would match funds up to half the cost of a new ultrasound machine, which would ultimately be donated to a local pregnancy center. The other half of the funds was to be raised by local Councils. At that point, then Grand Knight Rea Schmid assigned Mike Kleinschmidt to follow through on this project. Along with current Grand Knight Robert Pyfferon, Deputy Grand Knight Mike Wolter, and Brother Knight Paul Lorentz, the committee started to move forward. Brother Lorentz took on the task of finding a center which would meet the criteria of the national Ultrasound Initiative. After multiple telephone calls, e-mails, and other efforts, the Hastings TLCC was selected as the closest center which met the criteria. Brother Lorentz worked with the TLCC staff and ultrasound wholesalers to find a machine which met the specifications desired by the TLCC. The machine, with the latest technology, replaced TLCC's outdated, 8-year-old machine. Even with a steep discount provided by the Samsung wholesaler, the cost of the machine was still in excess of \$34,000. The Knights of Columbus Supreme Office funded approximately \$17,000, with the remaining funding coming from the following: the K of C Councils from St. John's and St. Francis (Rochester), St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (Hastings), and St. John's (Vermillion); the Bishop Edward A. Fitzgerald Assembly (Rochester), the Minnesota Knights Fund and a number of private donations. With great joy, on November 19, 2013, the new ultrasound machine was officially dedicated. The dedication was attended by over 100 supporters, visitors, board members and guests. All were warmly greeted by the TLCC staff.

Don Bradley read minutes from the November 7th meeting.

Robert asked Bou Gazley (District Deputy) to update the council on the District meetings regarding Degree Team schedules and various topics.

## Report from Bou Gazley:

- There will be one First Degree ceremony December 30th at St. Pius.
- March 8th is the next Major Degree Ceremony (1,2,3), which will be held at Pax Christi.
- An essay contest is being planned, the theme is "The Importance of Religious Freedom". The essay must be between 750 to 1000 words, with \$100 cash prize to the winner!

There is interest in starting a KC Squires Circle. Ideally each council would have its own circle, but initially the goal would be to have only one with all local councils supporting it until other Circles could be justified and supported.

The Squires is designed to develop young men as leaders who understand their Catholic religion, who have a strong commitment to the Church and who are ready, willing and capable of patterning their lives after the Youth Christ.

The importance of a Squires circle should not be underestimated. A circle helps mold young Catholic men into the strong leaders of tomorrow, while preparing these Squires for their future as active, contributing members of the Knights of Columbus.

## Robert continued with updates:

- January 9th, The First Degree ceremony will be held at the O'Day room with the Team meeting at 6:15pm, and the candidates at 6:30 and the ceremony starting at 7pm.
- Year end paperwork is due in late January and Feb. 15.

- Robert turned in the Rose sale proceeds as follows: \$40 seed \$ (from fall flower sales), plus sales of \$\$86.50 for a total of \$126.50.
